BEGINNING OF A LEARNING JOURNEY

At Church Langton, our curriculum, core values, and simple school rules work together to guide children as they grow into curious, kind, confident, and well-rounded individuals.

We strive each day to ensure every child feels excited to learn, experiences a strong sense of belonging, and builds positive relationships with both peers and adults. Our broad and balanced curriculum is enriched by a deep commitment to creativity and the arts. We're especially proud of our unique *Enrichment Programme*, which all children from Year 1 onwards enjoy weekly as part of their timetable.

In Reception, the focus is on nurturing relationships, establishing routines, and learning through practical, play-based activities. As children settle, they begin daily sessions in reading, writing, and number work, alongside physical, social, and communication development to support their overall growth.

In Key Stage 1 (Years 1 & 2) and Key Stage 2 (Years 3–6), children engage in daily English, Maths, and phonics (KS1), as well as retrieval practice to strengthen learning. Throughout the week, they enjoy a rich variety of subjects including Art or Design Technology, Music, Religious Education, PSHE, Geography or History, Science, Computing, and two hours of PE. In Key Stage 2, children also begin learning a modern foreign language.

We look forward to sharing this exciting journey with you and welcoming your child into our vibrant school community.

Ofsted

Church Langton was last inspected by Ofsted in 2022, with the report confirming that the school continues to be rated as good. The full findings and insights from the inspection are available in the report, which can be accessed via our website. To summarise, the report identified the following strengths:

- The school's curriculum is broad and ambitious.
- Pupils are committed to the school's golden rule that you should 'treat everyone as you would like to be treated'.
- Over time, pupils develop a love of reading. They read widely and often.
- The school provides a wide range of events and activities to enhance the curriculum.
- The school is well led and managed. Senior leaders have an accurate view of the school's strengths.
- Leaders have ensured that safeguarding is given the highest priority at the school.

SIAMS

Our school was inspected by SIAMS in November 2017. Whereas Ofsted report on the overall educational standards, SIAMS explores how a school's theologically rooted Christian vision influences everything—from leadership and curriculum to worship and relationships. The report considered the school to be **Outstanding** in each of the areas under consideration. The report states:

- The school's Christian character and values underpin relationships throughout the school, which have a significant impact on pupils' development.
- The leadership team has a strong vision for the school as a church school, living by Christian values, which are firmly embedded and inform practice at all levels.
- The governing body has a wide area of expertise and their role as critical friends is highly effective in driving progress.
- RE has a high profile in the school due to inspirational leadership and strong management support.









EXAMPLE OF A SCHOOL DAY

School begins: Gate opens at 8:40am Registration at 8:55am

Lunch: 12.00-1.00pm (Reception Children will start their lunch at 11.45am)

School ends: 3:15pm

While each day brings new learning experiences, we follow a consistent structure to help pupils feel settled and confident in their routine. After registration and the first lesson of the day, children gather in the main hall for collective worship - a valued time for reflection and togetherness.

Learning then continues through the morning until lunchtime. (Further details about our school lunch provision can be found later in the prospectus.)

At lunchtime, we run our Happy Lunchtimes programme, which outlines clear expectations and promotes positive behaviour. Pupils are offered a range of structured activities they can choose to take part in, helping to make break times enjoyable and inclusive.

Following lunch, the afternoon is filled with further learning before children either head home or join our wrap-around care and extra-curricular clubs.

Below is an example of our EYFS weekly timetable, offering a glimpse into the rhythm of life in our Reception class. After National Offer Day, we will be in contact with all our new starters to share the details on our school welcome programme and settling sessions - to ensure your child has a smooth transition into their school journey.

WRAP-AROUND CARE & EXTRA CIRRICULAR CLUBS

Church Langton's After School Club has proved a great success and is constantly changing to suit the demands of busy parents and active children. The club, run by school staff, is available for pupils of all year groups.

We provide themed arts and crafts, messy play, outdoor play, table and floor activities. After School Club starts at 3.15pm when a member of staff will children from the school hall. The children are then taken to the Langton Community Hall but also make use of the school field and 3G pitch.

SAFEGUARDING & CHILD PROTECTION

Church Langton C of E Primary School is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children, and expects all staff and volunteers to share this commitment. The Governing Body has a duty of care to pupils and all members of the school community. All staff and volunteers have regular training in child protection. There is a comprehensive Safeguarding Policy in place which, along with a policy for Health and Safety and a Prevent Strategy, is regularly reviewed by the Governing Body.

Our Safeguarding Policy can be found on the school website and is also available upon request from the school office.

It is important for parents to be aware that:

- Staff and volunteers in the school have a duty to report concerns about a child, whether this means the child may be in need of additional support or help of some kind, or whether it is thought that a child may be at risk.
- In some cases the school is obliged to refer children to children's social care, for children to be assessed for their needs or if an investigation into possible child abuse is required. In many cases there will already have been discussions between school staff and the parents of the child, and the situation and concerns will not be a surprise to the parents. However, parents may not be told that the school has referred their child to children's social care if it is thought that this might put the child at risk.


ADMISSIONS
